

Navigating immigration and visa requirements can be particularly stressful for students, especially in the aftermath of the pandemic. Post-pandemic students encounter distinct challenges that previous generations did not face. The immigration team at FSU International Programs has collaborated closely with these students, devising strategies to assist them in navigating complex immigration processes. Additionally, we have identified common issues that students encounter when applying for visas and other immigration documents.

#### Guiding International Students Through the U.S. Career Landscape

International student advisors are often the first connection to all things career for international students. This session will showcase career services programs, opportunities and partnership to help international students navigate career options. This session will go over establishing a successful partnership between the international services office and career services office, proven job searching strategies, and an approach to identifying international student friendly employers in order to help foster a supportive community that embraces diversity for international students to thrive in the U.S. job market.

#### Engaging Gen Z Through Study Abroad Marketing

Explore the dynamic world of Gen Z through a session focused on current trends backed by observations and research. This session emphasizes preparing students for international experiences through marketing, leveraging social media with impactful campaigns involving videos and Instagram Reels while they are abroad, and keeping them engaged upon return. We'll also discuss how to engage students through on-campus events. This session will explore how to connect, resonate, and inspire this generation on their global journey.

#### The Impact of Cultural Differences on International Students

Many international students travel to the U.S. for education; however, some find that there is a clash in cultural ideologies. This realization can lead to difficulties adjusting and/or self-isolation. It's essential to recognize that culture plays a crucial role in shaping our beliefs, values, behaviors, and perceptions of mental health and well-being. This session will explore the impact of cultural differences on the mental health of international students.

This session highlights the English language program at FSU, its programs, and services and will focus on what other English language programs can do to enhance and bolster their value to their own college or university.

In this session, we will discuss the faculty cycle within FSU International Programs and how we set our faculty members up for success while leading student groups abroad. Regular communication with faculty fosters a cohesive approach, aligning logistical considerations with academic enrichment goals. In this presentation, we will compare effective and noneffective channels of communication.

#### Balancing Risk with Independent, Community-Based, Experiential Education in Students' Experiences Abroad: The Global Scholars Story

The Global Scholars Program is a community-based educational experience, which prepares students to be able to ethically engage with communities as well as complete an independently derived experience in a variety of scenarios. As such, this program is required to balance two, often seen as opposing, concepts for student's experiences: duty of care and culminating an ethical engagement with a host environment. This session will take the audience through the process and utilize student accounts to explain the usefulness of such programming to help students engage better with their host environments.

#### Administrative Processing: The Student Experience




