This session will introduce the audience to Global Talk, a dynamic weekly event that brings students from diverse backgrounds together to share their languages and cultures in an interactive setting. We will showcase videos highlighting past sessions and invite two students—a U.S. honors student and an international student—to share their personal experiences. We will conduct a short demonstration, teaching the audience a few words in Basque through a game, allowing participants to experience how Global Talk sessions work.

BRIDGING CULTURES: EMBRACING DIVERSITY AND ENRICHING GLOBAL PERSPECTIVES

This session will be based on my personal experiences as an international student and my journey becoming an educator in the American public education system. There will be tidbits about making friends and assimilations to the new culture based on my personal experience as an international student at Florida State University and Tallahassee Community College. This session will enable participants to share their own cross-cultural experiences such as cultural shock, language barriers, and traditions to gain a better understanding of the unique perspectives, experiences, and values that contribute to the richness of academic and social environments.

LANGUAGE STUDY OVERSEAS (FOR FREE!): THE CRITICAL LANGUAGE SCHOLARSHIP

Come to learn about the U.S. Department of State's Critical Language Scholarship, a prestigious award that fully funds eight weeks of international travel and intensive language study. The CLS program is acclaimed for the language gains seen by its awardees and best known for a strict language pledge that requires awardees speak only their target language for the length of the program. Former program awardee, Amanda Yeargin, will share her alumni insight to help participants craft a compelling application. **Note: only U.S. citizens are eligible to apply. **

SOCIAL RESEARCH AS RESISTANCE: KESRF AND THE FUTURE OF KNOWLEDGE PRODUCTION

This session will explore how social research can function as a form of resistance against dominant narratives and structures of knowledge production, with a view to driving social change. It will focus on the Kendrobimukhi Emerging Social Researchers' Fund (KESRF)—a pioneering initiative that provides competitive research funding, mentorship, and a structured evaluation process for undergraduate social science students in Bangladesh, but the discussion will extend beyond Bangladesh through inviting participants to think about how similar models could be adapted to different contexts. Participants will engage in conversations about how funding, mentorship, and institutional support can shape the future of social research and its role in addressing real-world sociopolitical challenges.

PATHWAYS TO PEACE: STORYTELLING TOOLS AND GLOBAL MODELS TO LEAD WITH CURIOSITY, BOOST COLLABORATION AND SUSTAIN ENGAGEMENT

Join the conversation and expand your capacity as a leader, as we embrace curiosity and explore what is possible through the example of global youth leaders and Nobel Peace Prize winners collaborating for positive, sustainable change across 171 countries. Learn how you can engage storytelling to amplify your why, build your campus or community team, and foster sustainable futures. 
